What's New at the APA

- APA condemned racism and the negative mental health impact of gun violence in the wake of
 the tragic mass shooting that killed 8 people in Georgia. APA leadership offered condolences to
 the families of the victims and included resources for coping with trauma and disaster in the

- APA released a statement praising the inclusion of mental health funding in the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Approximately \$4 billion in funding for programs that support prevention and treatment of mental health and substance use disorders was included in the \$1.9 trillion coronavirus relief package passed by Congress. April Course of the Month – Pharmacological Approaches to Treatment-Resistant Depression

A significant proportion of patients who suffer from depression do not respond to standard antidepressant treatment. Unfortunately, it is unclear what, for a given patient, works best as a next step, pharmacological treatment. This course highlights the recent progress in identifying new therapies for depressed patients who have not responded to standard antidepressants, including atypical antipsychotics, as well as glutamatergic and GABAergic compounds.
